Message from the *Rabbi*

The Two Faces of Sefirat Ha'omer

During Pesach we will count a period of time known as Sefirat Ha'omer [the Counting of the Omer]. Starting from the second Seder, we begin a nightly countdown of forty-nine days that culminates in Shavuot, the anniversary of our receiving the Torah at Mount Sinai.

The great Rabbi Breitowitz gives a beautiful explanation of this time period. He explains that the Sefira ritual establishes a linkage between the freedom of Passover and the acceptance of G-d's sovereignty in our lives that occurred on Shavuot, reminding us in a very direct way that there can be no freedom without obligation, no liberty without responsibility, no meaningful autonomy without a commitment to a transcendent purpose that goes beyond mere material gratification.

Our Rabbis taught that it took the Jews 49 days to purify their thoughts, speech, and action until they become worthy of receiving G-d's Torah and during this period of time, we too should engage in this process of spiritual introspection in preparation for our own Kabbalat Ha'Torah (receiving of the Torah). (This is one of the reasons why Ethics of The Fathers is studied during this period.)

One would have expected that these 49 days would be marked by joyous anticipation and excitement, particularly as we get closer to the "great event." And yet according to halacha, the Sefira period, or at least a significant chunk of it, is commemorated by a number of observances that are connected to mourning and bereavement; weddings do not take place, we do not listen to instrumental music, nor do we shave or take haircuts. [Even within the halachic tradition, there are any number of variant customs--some commence mourning immediately from the second day of Pesach until the 33rd day of the Omer [Lag B'omer]; others do not commence until after the beginning of the month of Iyar and proceed until shortly before Shavuot with Lag B'omer as a hiatus.]

While the actual observance of mourning during Sefira is a post-Talmudic custom, its basis is rooted in an event recorded in the Talmud. According to a passage in Tractate Yevamot, 24,000 disciples of the great Rabbi Akiva died in a plague (or perhaps as part of the Bar Kochba uprising) between Pesach and Shavuot. At some point in the early Middle Ages, mourning rituals were instituted to commemorate the tragedy of those deaths (as well as other tragedies that occurred later during the Crusades). What is especially important is the reason the Talmud ascribes to their untimely demise: that, notwithstanding their great scholarship and piety, they did not show proper kavod (respect, honor) to each other.

Rabbi Samson Raphael Hirsch, the great 19th century leader

of German Jewry, explains that kavod is far more than mere civility, politeness, or the thin veneer of tolerance that may mask a barely-concealed disdain; rather, the word kavod is etymologically related to the word for "heaviness," "weight," "significance."

Truly honoring a human being means you regard them as inherently significant, weighty, worthwhile, having something of value that they contribute to the world. Kavod means you see the other as a beloved child of G-d as indeed he or she is--to not necessarily agree with all they may have said or done but to recognize the essential goodness within their souls for that too is G-d's will.

As parents and teachers recognize, when we strive to see the goodness in our fellow Jew--even if we have to strain our eyes a little bit--the perception becomes the reality and that goodness becomes manifest and actualized. Conversely, when the message we communicate by word, gesture, or just neglect is "you don't count," "you don't matter," the recipient responds in kind.

We thus mourn during the Sefira period not merely to commemorate an isolated tragedy--which after all is hardly unique in the annals of Jewry's blood-soaked history--but to remind ourselves that our own ability to re-accept G-d's Torah depends in large part on unity, ahavat yisrael, and seeing our fellow Jews with kavod. Rather than undermining our preparation for the joyous event of Matan Torah, remembering the sins of R. Akiva's disciples is part and parcel of that very preparation.

In a sense, therefore, Sefirat Ha'omer embodies two paradoxical notions that at first blush appear mutually exclusive. By reiterating on a daily basis that freedom derives its value only when coupled with the discipline and commitment of Torah, Sefira calls upon us to intensify our adherence and fidelity to Jewish ritual and Torah study. By remembering the students of Rabbi Akiva, we are reminded of the imperatives of achdut (unity), ahavat yisrael (love of Israel), and kavod.

It is easy to identify in our own experiences zealously-committed Jews, passionate about their faith but rejecting of all who do not share those commitments. There are others who perhaps appear gracious and tolerant, exemplars of ahavat yisrael, but stand for nothing, believe in very little, and essentially subscribe to moral and religious relativism. The period of Sefira calls upon us all to transcend these narrow dichotomies: to have faith without rejection; commitment without intolerance; fidelity without divisiveness; and passion without exclusion. Not an easy task but whoever said being a good Jew was?

Some highlights for this past year include:

- The addition of programs for your youngest, such as the grand-opening of our Montessori school and the creation of our Bar and Bat Mitzvah clubs.
- An expanded events calendar that generated even greater attendance to our Purim Masquerade Party, Purim picnic and Hanukkah party – were more than 500 people attended.
- We hosted seven family nights, each attended by over 275 persons.

The "Chai-Couture" Fashion Show our Women's Committee hosted in conjunction with Hadassah a smash-hit production – honoring our Community's fashion leaders. The Purim festival featured standing-room only attendance for the reading of the Megillah and a much-anticipated Maccabeats performance, as well as our annual Purim picnic. Our Women's Committee and Next Generation Leaders Committee (NGLC)- comprised of up and coming leaders in our Community- did a fantastic job coordinating the events. I encourage all of you to contribute to our positive momentum by continuing to step forward, and have a hand in making Temple Moses, truly, Your Community.

Challah Making Event with Deena Hadar at Grace Del Castillo shouse



INGREDIENTS:

5 lbs of flour (14-16 cups) (flour can be all white or a combination of 1/2 white flour and 1/2 whole wheat flour)

3 T. dry yeast

3 eggs

1 1/2 C. oil

1 1/2 C. sugar

2 T. salt

3 1/2 to 4 cups warm water

Dissolve yeast in 2 cups of the warm water and sprinkle in a pinch of sugar. When it bubbles, it is considered "proofed" meaning the yeast is active.

Add 3/4 of the flour to a large mixing bowl. Sprinkle salt and sugar over the flour. Make a well in the middle and add eggs, oil and the water with the yeast, plus another 1 1/2 cups of water. (to make 3 1/2 cups total water) Mix together incorporating all of the ingredients, then add the rest of the flour. Only use the final 1 cup of water a little at a time if necessary. Mix well until dough pulls away from the sides of the bowl.

Turn onto a floured board and knead for approximately 10 minutes. Add only enough additional flour to make the dough manageable. Knead until dough is smooth and elastic, spring back when pressed lightly.

Do the mitzva of taking challah with a blessing

Place dough in a large oiled bowl. Turn it over so that the top will be oiled as well. Cover with a towel and let rise in a warm place for 2 hours.

Form into loaves and put on greased baking sheets or baking sheets covered with parchment paper. Let rise again until double in size (approximately 1-2 hours)

Brush with a beaten egg (gently) and sprinkle with sesame or poppy seeds. Bake at 350 degrees in a preheated oven approximately 20 minutes or until browned.

or

Form into loaves and wrap in foil sprayed with cooking spray. Place in zip lock bags. Freeze. When you plan to use them, take them out of freezer in the morning and place on a greased baking sheet. Let them defrost and rise. It takes about 4-5 hours to defrost and rise. Bake as above.

Or

Divide the dough, unbraided into 5 or 6 ziplock bags (each with enough dough for one loaf.) On the day you want to eat your challa, defrost and let dough come to room temperature, braid, let rise for an hour, and bake.

Tastes like you made the dough that day!

Un kafiko con... Victoria Rodríguez

En cada esquina del paisaje a nuestro derredor hay una historia. Larga, corta, más o menos interesante, pero que tiene al menos un dato que merece ser tenido en consideración. Por ejemplo: ¿sabían ustedes que las sillas a las que nos sentamos en los banquetes de nuestro templo fueron donadas por el Comité de Damas durante la presidencia compartida por Victoria Rodríguez y Geny Behar? ¡Ahá! Ahora no me culpen si cada vez que asistan a una fiesta en el Moses (¡y BH hay tantas siempre!), mientras buscan su sitio entre las mesas, puede que, por una fracción de segundo, quizás asocien mentalmente ese momento con nuestras damas y las que las han lidereado experimentando cierta gratitud, ¿no? ¡Especialmente si consiguen un buen puesto!

El kafiko de hoy lo he de tomar con alguien muy especial. Mientras ajustamos la cámara buscando un ángulo perfecto para intentar filmar nuestra conversación, atisbo, de refilón, la armonía con que comparten espacio entre estas paredes de colores cálidos, piezas de arte antiguas y modernas, vitrales, pinturas y fotos de una familia que me dicen es, no solamente hermosa, sino muy unida.

Siempre me ha llamado la atención Victoria Rodríguez. Esta señora es, sin lugar a dudas, síntesis de modernidad, inteligencia, conocimiento y clase. Su corazón es joven. Su pasión desde que, recién retirada, llegó a Miami es, a todas luces, su comunidad. Hoy quiero enterarme, finalmente, de quién es, en realidad, esta bella y enigmática señora a la que siempre he observado desde lejos, intrigada y admirada. Victoria nos recibe esta noche en su hogar y nos concede el privilegio de compartir con ella este humeante kafiko.

Nacida en la Habana, Victoria es la menor de los cinco hijos de Caló Esquenazi Z'L, y Samuel Morhaim Z'L, ambos naturales de Silíbria y Estambul, respectivamente. Vivió la mayor parte de su niñez a unos pasos del Chevet-ahim, la sinagoga sefaradí más antigua de Cuba, irónicamente situada en la calle Inquisidor de la Habana Vieja.

Victoria se hizo maestra "normalista", que es como le llamaban a las graduadas de la Escuela Normal, cantera del magisterio cubano. Era el año 1948 en que esta recién graduada de sólo 18 años se presenta a oposiciones y gana una plaza impartiendo enseñanza elemental ... nada menos que en Jaruco. ¡Jaruco! Todos los días, por los próximos cinco años - ¡sin faltar un día al trabajo! - la joven Victoria tomaba la famosa lanchita de Regla en el muelle de Luz, cruzaba la Bahía de la Habana, tomaba el tren de Hershey y, cuando se apeaba en Jaruco, ahí la esperaba un niño sosteniendo un caballo por las riendas para de allí trotar al bohío donde estaba la escuela. Victoria me cuenta que los padres y los niños la llegaron a querer tanto que le construyeron con gran amor una escuela más sólida que aquel frágil bohío.

Nuevamente presenta oposiciones y logra una plaza en la municipalidad de Regla donde llegó meteóricamente a ocupar el cargo de directora. Poco después, en 1955, trabaja en el Teodoro Hertzl de maestra de quinto y sexto grados. Su siguiente cátedra será en la Escuela Pública Número Ocho, la misma escuela de la

Habana Vieja donde de niña cursara sus estudios primarios. Allí, sus antiguas maestras serían ahora sus colegas.



Victoria confiesa que le encanta estudiar. ¿Sabían ustedes que tiene tres doctorados? El primero fue en el 54, en que se hace Doctora en Pedagogía de la Universidad de La Habana. En Estados Unidos hace una maestría en Consejería Escolar en el Bank Street College y, más adelante, otra en Psicología en el Brooklyn College.

Muchos "chicos y chicas" de nuestra comunidad, ex discípulos del Teodoro Hertzl deben recordar a su joven maestra cuya boda fue, precisamente, durante ese curso que allí impartió. Años antes, durante la boda de Graciela Maya y Roberto Maya Z'L, en 1950, conoció a un joven estudiante de Arquitectura, Julio Rodríguez Z'L. Del matrimonio nacieron sus hijos Jaime y Sammy. 

HAMENTASHEN

by Ida Behar

INGREDIENTS :

1 cup butter or margarine, softened
1 cup sugar
3 large eggs divided
2 teaspoon vanilla extract
3 ½ tablespoons orange juice
1 teaspoon baking powder
½ teaspoon salt
4 cups all purpose flour
Flour for rolling

FILLINGS:

Poppy seed
apricot
raspberry
prune
chocolate
or guayaba



DIRECTION:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees . Grease cookie sheets.
2. In a large bowl, cream the butter and sugar at medium speed until smooth. Beat in 2 eggs, one at the time, then stir in the orange juice and vanilla.
3. Mix baking powder, salt and flour in another bowl.
4. Add to cream mixture. You'll get a sticky dough.
5. Divide dough into 4 balls, cover with plastic wrap.
6. Roll each ball on a lightly floured surface out to ¼ inch thickness. Cut into a 3 inch circles.
7. Beat remaining egg with 1 teaspoon of water. Brush the rim of circles with the egg wash.
8. Place 1 teaspoon of fruit fillings in center and pinch the sides of each circle to form a triangle, leaving the center slightly open.
9. Place on cookie sheets and bake 15 to 18 minutes. Yield more than 40 hamentashens.
