

# Message from the



Rabbi Daniel Hadar

Immediately before G-d gave the Ten Commandments, the Torah describes the lights and sounds the people experienced. They saw lightning and heard thunder. In fact, according to the Midrash, they somehow heard the lightening and saw the thunder as well.

After Matan Torah (the Giving of the Torah), a nearly identical experience is described, but this time, the wording is slightly different. It says they saw torches and heard the thunder. Why is there this difference? What is the significance of the change from lightning to torches?

Our rabbis offer a fascinating and profound insight. The change in visualization symbolizes a spiritual transformation in the way the Jewish people perceived holiness, and this transformation was a direct result of the experience of receiving the Torah.

Before the Torah was given, spirituality could be achieved only through divorcing oneself from the world. All human souls yearn for transcendence; everything yearns to return to its source. Our source is G-d, and therefore, it is a natural human urge to yearn for the Divine, for meaning. However, the only way to achieve this in the pre-Sinai world was to separate from the physical. This form of spirituality is compared to a lightning flash. It allows you to reach a very high level, but then, like the lightning, that flash of transcendence is followed by total darkness – because human beings inevitably must eat, must sleep and must live in the material world. We still see this in non-Jewish spirituality, where people take vows of celibacy and poverty, or remove themselves to a mountaintop.

After the Torah was given, the image was no longer of the lightning, but of the torch. That image is a much different one. And it is a somewhat tragic image, in its way. A torch will never give the brilliant light of a lightning bolt. But a torch is steady and enduring. The lesson the people learned through receiving the Torah was that spirituality could indeed be contained in daily life. The physical world, the mundane, could be elevated and infused with the spiritual. They were not mutually exclusive. We serve G-d not only when we learn or pray, but also in the way that we eat or drink, conduct our business, earn and spend our money, raise our children and relate to our spouses. Every activity of life can be, and must be, invested with depth, significance and meaning. Yes, the daily life of carpools and laundry and board meetings will not offer the transcendence of the moment on the mountaintop, but if one can understand the purpose of even the mundane, then life can hold a holiness that will far outlast the bolt of lightning.

No one would navigate a road filled with dangerous turns by lightning. Even with a torch, it is difficult. But a torch provides the steady light, the warmth and comfort, to help us navigate the difficult turns in life and make it safely to the comfort of home.



# NOODLE KUGEL FOOD NEHWORK

Ingredients

I/2 pound wide egg noodles
I teaspoon of vanilla
I/2 stick butter, melted
I pound cottage cheese
2 cups sour cream
I/2 cup sugar
6 eggs
I teaspoon ground cinnamon
I/2 cup raisins

#### Directions

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.

Boil the noodles in salted water for about 7 to 8 minutes. Strain noodles from water. In a large mixing bowl, combine noodles with remaining ingredients and pour into a greased, approximately 9-by-13-inch baking dish, sprinkle some cinnamon and sugar over the top.

Bake until custard is set and top is golden brown, about 60 minutes.





# Uw kafiko kow... Estherita Garazi

We have this kafiko today with the matriarch of one of our community's prominent families. Esther Egozi Bejar de Garazi or, as most know her: "Estherita", welcomes me to her home. She is surrounded by beautiful orchids and warm good taste

I'm not going to dwell much on the history for soon hers truly will tell it better in her memoirs, how it all started, from Manzanillo, after Hasköy and Silivría (in today's Istambul), the history of this family that converged with the Garazi's of Siria from the day when they met, became friends and later fell in love...it all began during board elections for the Macabi youth group on Prado Street. Salomón Z"L was elected that day... with the vote of young Esther of course!

Many decades later, family pictures of the couple, their children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren displayed in every corner of this home, give testimony of the brightest treasure in Estherita's life: her precious family. This image of old friends linked by ties such as common history and roots, moved her so much that right then and there the rest of her life

would change ... for the benefit of this community! From that moment forward, at the request of Victoria Adouth Z"L, she started

trying to create a group of young couples. It would soon evolve into what is today's Women's Committee... as the men did not want to participate with them!

By 1969 Esther is elected as their first president. She stays in charge for a year and later on comes back to the post in order to work intensely helping with the events surrounding Temple Moses inauguration of its new building. Between both periods as president she works on the creation of the adult education classes, picnics, parties, art auctions and our tenor Isaac Salinas' first concert. During those years there are enough funds raised to be able to purchase the building next door, where our kitchen is today.

There is a popular saying that behind every great man, there is an extraordinary woman. When we think about one of our "grandes", Salomón Garazi Z"L, we cannot forget that his first and foremost support came from his mate, his best friend and his most enthusiastic fan, our dearest Estherita.

The evening went by smoothly with such rich and animated conversation that could fill a long article sprinkled with very interesting anecdotes. In any case, I sip this chocolate-flavored kafico and count our blessings for having in our community ladies of the caliber of our dear Esther Garazi.

# A New Treatment for Sinus Problems

Millions of Americans suffer from chronic or intermittent sinus problems. Symptoms can include nasal congestion, facial pressure or pain, post nasal drip, nasal discharge, and recurrent infections. Numerous medications are available for treatment, both over the counter and by prescription. Even with use of medications, however, many patients remain symptomatic some or all of the time. And even the best medications can often have unwanted side effects.

In the past, people who failed medical therapy could be treated with surgery. While endoscopic sinus surgery is effective, like all operations it necessitates time off from work for post operative recovery, causes pain during healing, and has risks of significant, although mostly rare, complications. Because of this, many patients who could be helped with surgery were hesitant to have it done.

Recently, a new technique for surgical treatment of sinus disease was developed. Called balloon sinuplasty, it is a method of opening up blocked sinus drainage pathways by placing a tiny balloon through the nose into the sinus opening and inflating it, then removing the balloon. Like angioplasty in heart arteries, it is designed to dilate open partially or completely blocked channels, in this case to help the sinuses return to normal health.

Initially done only in the operating room, balloon sinuplasty can now be done in the doctor's office under local anesthesia. This well tolerated procedure is much less invasive than endocospic sinus surgery and therefore is not oly less risky by also has a much quicker recovery. The procedure usually takes under an hour and most patients can return to work within a couple of days. Furthermore, the vast majority of patients get significant relief of their nasal symptoms which has been shown to last for at least two years after the procedure.

Not all sinus sufferers, however, are candidates for the balloon treatment. Those with large pylops, a badly deviated septum, fungus in the sinus, or certain other situations may still need more traditional sinus surgery. If you are suffering from persistent or recurrent sinus problems, please seek evaluation by an ear, nose and throat physician. Lasting relief may be available as close as the doctor's office.

Throughout Jewish Communities, the world over, you will find this strong commitment to Education and that is represented and celebrated on this holiday of Shavuot.





# Jewish Life in Today's Krakow, Warsaw, and Berlin

KRAKOW - On our recent trip to Poland and Germany, we decided to see how large the remaining Jewish populations are in those countries.

While visiting Krakow, Poland, and simultaneously referencing the internet for information, we found there were few tour options dedicated to current Jewish life. The only tours that existed were visits to the Auschwitz Bikernau Concentration Camp. We took the well organized tour on a dreary, rainy morning.

The next day, we found a little trolley offering tours about Jewish Krakow. During the tour, we visited the Remu Syangoga (an entrance fee is required) and noticed it was simply a tourist attraction at this point. According to the Times of Israel, they only hold services once a year during Synagogue week in June. Only two artifacts remained inside, a tevah and an aaron akodesh with no hint of a torah.

On another day, we visited Oskar Schindler's factory. They were many Jewish tourists accompanying us, but only as few as 200 were living there in Krakow.



WARSAW - after a 3 hour train ride, we arrived in Poland's Capital where we searched for information about the current state of Jewish life there. One day we visited the Nozyk Synagogue and were told it was the only synagogue that was not destroyed during WW2. As we entered, we noticed Rabbi Michael Schudrich in the middle of a conference with a large group of young visitors from Australia. After he finished speaking with them, we asked him what a seemingly shy American rabbi was doing in Poland. He responded by saying "it was insanity". He explained that as young man in the 1970's he visited the country with a group of American teenagers and was impressed by the rich history of Jewish life there. He returned to Warsaw in 2000 as a rabbi and was later appointed to be the chief rabbi in that city in 2004.

Next, we visited the Jewish Museum and it had an impressive exhibit of Jewish history in Warsaw during WW2. From there we went to the New Museum of Jewish Living. It was a large complex with a beautiful glass façade surrounded by statues. Unfortunately, we could not enter because it closes on Tuesdays.

Outside of the building, we met an Israeli born Rabbi, Avraham Haim from one the Sephardic synagogues in Istanbul. He was also trying to convince the guards to let us visit inside, but with no luck.

Our last stop was the Progressive Synagogue Beith Polska of Warsaw, located on the outskirts of the city. It is 2 story house converted into a small Temple. There we met Rabbi Haim Beliak. He explained to us that they are a very small community, but have a school and summer camp for the children.



BERLIN – after a 5 hour train ride, we arrived at our last stop. We first visited the New Synagogue Berlin Centrum. It has seating for 3,000 people and was inaugurated in 1866. Later it was destroyed by the Nazis in 1938. We were under the impression that it was completely rebuilt in the last few years due to its fine condition, but found out that only a part of the building was rebuilt and is now used as a museum that hosts the most prominent exhibits.

Next, we also visited the Berlin Holocaust Memorial designed by American architect, Peter Eisenman. It is laid out on 4.7 acres near the Brandenburg Gate. It was highly impressive. Later on a Friday night, we went for Shabbat Services at the Tiferet Israel. It is the only Sephardic Orthodox synagogue in town. There were 18 members present at the time, lead by Rabbi Awaraham Daus from Yemen. The services reminded us of our own Temple Moses. After the services, we

were invited to a Kiddush where we were able to meet some of its members. They were all of different nationalities. They consisted of Azerbaijanis, Moroccans, Israelis, and Russians. None of them spoke Ladino. We talked to the English speaking ones and asked their thoughts on living in Berlin. Was there any anti-Semitism? They answered by saying "it is the same as any other country". They mentioned that there has recently been an influx of young Israelis working in Germany looking for better opportunities.

As a side not, we were happy to see there were many school children visiting Jewish museums and sites during our stay to both cities.
